




Recurring, Long-Term Vision Care Needs



Segment Overview: Optometry

- Optometry: approximately \$15 billion in estimated, annual U.S. spending on products and vision care services
- Optometrists or ODs are licensed professionals who have received a Doctor of Optometry degree
- With growth in vision care, the number of practicing U.S. ODs has risen to over 40,000 and is projected to continue to rise to 46,000 by 2022
- With the corresponding number of ophthalmologists expected to remain flat, there is opportunity for optometrists to expand their service offering
- Independent ODs perform 53% of all primary eye care services
- Over 80% of ODs also perform some medical eye care services, included such treatment as ocular infections and allergies and glaucoma




Segment Overview: Ophthalmology

- Ophthalmology: represents approximately \$12 billion in estimated, annual U.S. spending on vision services and products annually
 - 33% of the broader vision care category spend
 - U.S. demand for ophthalmic goods is forecast to rise 2.8% yearly through 2020
- Ophthalmologists are highly trained MDs providing a broad range of specialized surgeries and services in eye care

- There are currently ~ 18,000 ophthalmologists in the U.S., which is expected to remain flat through 2020
- Consistent growth of vision correction surgery provides significant demand: potential refractive surgery market of 10+ mm individuals
- Growing shortages in ophthalmologists present opportunities for ophthalmology practice management (including provider consolidation); service pricing and service expansion by ODs




Managed Care and Medicare Trends

Managed Plan Coverage for Optometric Care


